Basel's Orbit | A satellite fair has launched its own satellite fair. The founders of **Aqua Art Miami**, which takes place at the **Aqua Hotel** during **Art Basel Miami Beach**, have announced **Aqua Wynwood**.

The contemporary-art event will also be held during **Basel**, from December 6 to 9, in a 28,000-square-foot warehouse just south of Miami's **Rubell Family Collection**. The space allows for 45 stalls ranging from 200 to 850 square feet, renting for \$40 per square foot.

Lisa Boyle will show *Patas*, 2007, by Amy Jane Porter, at Aqua Wynwood.



"We have the largest booths that are available to galleries outside of Basel itself," says Seattle artist **Dirk Park**, who cofounded **Aqua Art Miami** two years ago with fellow Seattle artist **Jaq Chartier**.

Also setting **Aqua Wynwood** apart is that **Park** and **Chartier** have leased the warehouse year-round, giving them more control over the site's layout. (It will remain empty between the fair's annual editions.) Sheetrock construction, exhibition-quality lighting and four walls instead of three for most of the booths will make this "comparable to a programmable gallery space anywhere," says **Park**.

Galleries that have already leaped at the duo's invitation to participate are **Lisa Boyle**, in Chicago; **Plane Space**, in New York; **James Harris**, in Seattle; and **Elizabeth Leach**, in Portland. In fact, half the booths at their satellite's satellite were spoken for as early as July.
